THE SPIRIT OF TASMANIA CYCLING TOUR IS ONE OF THE OLDEST AND MOST PRESTIGIOUS NATIONAL CYCLING TOURS IN AUSTRALIA, FIRST RACED IN 1930.

THE TOUR SHOWCASES PICTURESQUE
TASMANIAN TERRAIN WITH SWEEPING PLAINS,

The introduction of the Women's Stage Race in 2018 elevated the event to a new level, underpinning the growth of professional female racing within the Australian cycling community.

Seeking to capitalise on the Tasmanian brand and in-depth knowledge of local cycling, this year's race is organised by Eudaimonia Tasmanian Cycling Tours (TCT) and led by a female team for the first time. This will see the race reach its full potential as a true showcase of what Tasmania has to offer!

IN 2023, THE SPIRIT OF TASMANIA CYCLING TOUR WILL BE STAGED FROM THE 8^{TH} - 12^{TH} NOVEMBER IN NORTHERN TASMANIA.

The 2022 Spirit of Tasmania Cycling Tour consisted of a total of 116 riders, made up of 75 male riders and 41 female riders.

While the event did not run in 2020 or 2021 due to the ongoing effects of COVID-19 pandemic, the 2022 tour saw an increase of 24% in female participation levels compared to the 2019 tour, showing the need for competitive cycling at a national level.

The Spirit of Tasmania Cycling Tour is considered a 'must do' event on the Australian cycling calendar due to the success of past tour winners Cadel Evans and Richie Porte. More recently Dylan Sunderland and Sarah Gigante both advanced to join UCI tour teams to race on the international circuit immediately after winning the tour.

This year we are going to be bringing a larger participation and spectator aspect into the tour by adding two participation events over the duration of the tour; both the prologue stage and stage 3. We will also be changing the stage 3 route to better cater for participation and a festival aspect of the event.

Moving forward, we are looking at moving the tour into three main regional hubs to better showcase the varying terrain and scenery that Tasmania has to offer, while distributing the economic impact evenly across the state.

We are also increasing the number of women's racing days and participation to be in line with the men's format in 2024.



A watt-dropping short 550m burst up Bourke Street featuring 62m of climbing up steep switchbacks, an average grade of 11.9% at a maximum gradient of 15.3%.

The idea of this stage will be to bring in larger participation and spectator numbers. We will achieve this by moving the start time to the afternoon, allowing school kids to be involved after school as well as organising music, a couple of food vans and some other activities to improve engagement during the stage.



PROLOGUE ELEVATION PROFILE





STAGE 1 - ELEVATION PROFILE





STAGE 2 - ELEVATION PROFILE






FRIDAY NOV 10TH - LONGFORD TO POATINA






SATURDAY NOV 11TH - PENGUIN/GUNNS PLAINS LOOP




STAGE 4 - ELEVATION PROFILE


